Tasting Notes:

Juicy, fruit driven, yet light in the mouth and a finishing crunch.

Production Notes:

The only 2 rows of Shiraz planted in Mount Gambier. The fruit is grown on one of Mount Gambier's unique sites with an abundance of ancient flint rock and limestone close to the ocean. Carbonic macerated for 5 days then de-stemmed for juice contact with it's skins for 24 hours pressed and stored in stainless steel on lees for 8 months before being rested in bottle for a further 8 months.

Mount Gambier Facts:

- Mt. Gambier is one of Australia's youngest volcanos - erupting less than 6000 years ago.
- Located within the Limestone Coast zone, (South-East of South Australia,) the Mount Gambier region has been established as a viticultural region since 1982.
- Extremely unique terroir consisting of lava caves, aquifers, sinkholes and lake-filled crater and ash has weathered into a well drained, highly fertile loam.
