Tasting Notes:

Big, bright varietal cassis and rhubarb aromas mingle with hints of cocoa, tobacco and cashew nuts. Plush and dense fruits delicately framed by velvety tannins. Fresh and lively but layered and long.

Production Notes:

Warm north-facing sites tend to produce the best fruit. As is common in other regions, Cabernet Sauvignon in Great Western is picked late in the vintage season to allow for good fruit flavor and texture. More time on the vine results in a supple wine with intense varietal characteristics.
