Aromas of kaffir lime and nashi pear with a jasmine lift. Zesty citrus, crunchy red apple skin supported by a steely backbone.

Production Notes:

Riesling vines were first planted as part of Henry Best's 'Nursery Block' vineyard in the 1860s. From subsequent plantings in 1944 and 1978, Riesling became a significant part of our regime.
