“The Matilda” Chardonnay



Tasting Notes:

Flavorsome Hunter Valley Chardonnay, grapefruit and melon flavors with adept oak influence. On the palate the wine is structured and complex with a dry cashew finish.

Production Notes:

Sourced from 50 year old vines in the James Estate vineyard. Fermented in a combination of both stainless-steel tank and oak, and aged for 10 months in tank.

About Kirkton Estate:

Kirkton Estate was the first vineyard to be established in the Hunter Valley by John Busby in 1830. Kirkton’s historic importance grew from its intrinsic association with James Busby, (son of John Busby) and its role in being the incubator for what remains the largest and most diverse viticulture assessment project undertaken in Australia.

Cellaring:

Drink now or cellar for up to 5 years.

About Hunter Valley:

- Located in New South Wales, Hunter Valley is Australia’s oldest wine region, dating back to the early 19th century.
- Top varietals planted in Hunter Valley are Chardonnay, Shiraz, and Semillon.
