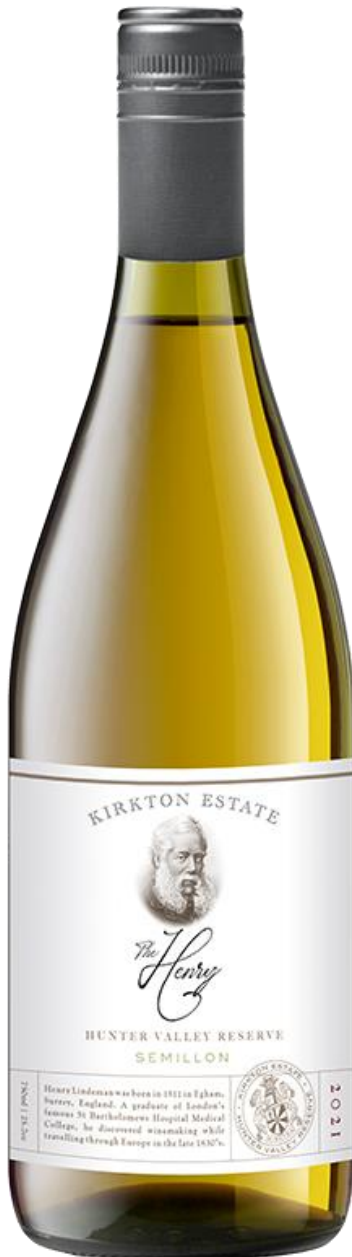


Kirkton Estate

Tasting Notes:

Intense citrus aromas with subtle notes of wildflower. The palate is crisp and fresh with grapefruit on the finish. This wine is built to age for decades!

Production Notes:

Sourced from 40+ year old vines in the sandy soils of the Hordem vineyard. Both fermentation and aging take place in stainless-steel tanks

About Kirkton Estate:

Kirkton Estate was the first vineyard to be established in the Hunter Valley by John Busby in 1830. Kirkton’s historic importance grew from its intrinsic association with James Busby, (son of John Busby) and its role in being the incubator for what remains the largest and most diverse viticulture assessment project undertaken in Australia.
